

#### Smart Camera Technology Zenus Facial Analysis









#### **ZENUS: FACIAL ANALYSIS TECHNOLOGY**

- Filming occurs that already capture faces throughout the meeting
- Smart camera passively analyzes hundreds of faces and produces metrics such as impressions, demographics (age/sex), and positive sentiment (happiness) over time. Gathers aggregate audience information in the general sessions and Expo Hall as data points to help in making future Annual Meeting decisions.
  - This is Facial Analysis, **NOT Facial Recognition**. The system can only detect faces. It can't uniquely identify a person.
  - This adheres to ethical AI standards ensuring the data is captured responsibly and respects the privacy of all event attendees.



#### **ZENUS: FACIAL ANALYSIS TECHNOLOGY**

- No video of this is being recorded or stored.
- No personally identifiable information is being collected.
- All information gathered is anonymous.







#### Methodology & Definitions

- **Impressions**: traffic at the point of interest (non-unique visitors)
- Stop Rate: how often people walking by the booth/activation stopped (min. 15 seconds)
- Sentiment & Energy: measures positive facial expressions (smiles, cheeks, forehead, etc.)
- Demographics:



# Key Findings & Recommendations



### Key Takeaways

- APHA took advantage of **complimentary** use of this innovative technology at the 2023 Annual Meeting.
- Tool will help our Events team as well as other APHA departments improve the attendee experience at the annual meeting.
- APHA Central was effectively set up to create traffic flow, and interaction across each element by demographic depending on the activations that were most relevant to each segment.
- Three-quarters of the sessions had great and exceptional ratings (higher than 50% sentiment rating). *This shows session organizers understand the needs of their audiences.*

## Key Findings

#### Show Floor:

- The Wellness Lounge performed well, ranking in the top 3 for highest energy among all sessions. Continuing to offer wellness opportunities will resonate with attendees and increase the energy of the event.
- Leadership Lab sessions out-performed the Emerging Scholars Theatre sessions which would align with the younger audience demographics suggesting interest in professional development. Further investigation is needed into content, delivery/presentation style, etc. to determine other reasons for variance.
- The Press Merchandise Area had the highest impressions, high stop rate, and high positive sentiment, indicating that the products were popular and appealing.

## **Energy Rank For All Sessions**

#### **Session Rank By All Events**

- 1. 62.1% Zumba Wellness
- 2. 58.4% Empower yourself. Defend and Heal with Personal Safety Skills
- 3. 57% APHA Dance
- 56.7% Virtual Leadership: Maximizing Online Tools and Perfecting Your Skills
- 5. 55.9% Monday General Session

- Wellness Activities ranked in top 3 for highest energy among all sessions.
- Leadership Lab sessions also ranked highly overall.
- Only one of the three general sessions ranked in the top five. While the energy score is in the exceptional range, when considered alongside the show floor activations, we see other areas of greater engagement than the general sessions.

 The Monday General Session scored the highest, with a score above 55, which is considered exceptional. The timing and / or the content worked well for participants.


