Policy Debate

Ongoing philosophical tensions:

- Role of government vs. personal responsibility
- Size (\$\$) of government vs. revenue obligations
- Short term costs vs. long-term gains
- General welfare vs. equity

Healthy Housing

- Ongoing organizational priorities:
 - Modernizing public health system
 - Do governmental public health agencies have foundational capabilities (surveillance/environmental inspection, etc.) to address health issues in the home?
 - Prioritizing prevention in reforming healthcare delivery system
 - Who do payers hold accountable for health outcomes affected by housing conditions? How? When?



Healthy Housing

- Ongoing organizational priorities:
 - Integrating social and health supports
 - Do HUD dollars remediate conditions that negatively impact health?
 - □ Does HUD policy permit smoking in public housing?
 - \square What is the role for other agencies?
 - □ What is the role of private actors?
