

Community Assessment Program



- Triage inquiries related to exposure to environmental contaminants at Superfund and other hazardous waste sites
- Evaluate potential human exposure to environmental contaminants
- Evaluate suspected elevations in diseases thought to be related to the environment

Medford Public Housing: Lead in Soil



Environmental Toxicology Program



- Provide exposure-based health assessments through the analysis of environmental sampling and toxicological data
- Collect and evaluate biomonitoring data (such as PCB levels in blood) in communities affected by hazardous waste sites

Indoor Air Quality Program

- Provide chemical emergency response support
- Evaluate indoor environmental concerns (e.g. PCBs, mercury)
- Developed MDPH Guidance on health risks associated with PCB-containing materials in schools and public buildings to complement EPA remedial guidance



Provide information, education, and outreach to health professionals and the general public on health effects associated with environmental hazards, working in conjunction with other BEH programs and ATSDR.


